## Word From The Pastor

We will soon begin our Parish Religious Education Program for our children and youth. We pray for them and for our catechists, those who will guide them in the program. Dr. Lorraine De Luca from the Diocese of Beaumont writes of catechists:

Catechists who are missionary disciples can no longer see themselves as õvolunteers.ö The word missionary comes from the Latin word which means õto send.ö This implies that someone is sending and someone is being sent out for a particular task. One definition of õvolunteerö focuses on the willingness of a person to freely take on some role or service. While catechists fulfill this definition, it does not take into account that catechists are called and sent by Jesus into the world much as he called and sent out disciples to preach in his name. At the end of Matthewes Gospel, we hear the words Jesus spoke to his disciples before ascending into heaven, which are the words he speaks to each baptized Catholic today: õGo, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age," (Matthew 28:19-20) . . .

As missionary disciples witnesses to the meaning of Jesus and the teachings of the Church in her or his life, and is not someone who just tells others what to believe or how to live. Entwined together, scriptures, tradition, and the witness of the catechist present the learner with a fuller picture of what it means to be a Catholicô being in a loving relationship with Jesus in the community of the Church and living as Jesus challenges us to live.

## Scripture Insights

As Jesus continues to journey toward Jerusalem, he makes a second prediction that his journey will end in his Death and Resurrection.

As with the prediction last Sunday, the disciples fail to understand its meaning. They are so preoccupied with their own ambitions that they have failed to confront Jesusø realityô so in conflict with their expectations: õThey had been discussing who was the greatest.ö Jesus uses this opportunity to illustrate true discipleship: õIf anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.ö True leadership, says Jesus, is servant leadership!

Taking a little child, Jesus draws everyoneøs



attention to this child. A child is vulnerable and powerless with no influence at all. Especially in the lowest level of societies

hierarchy. Children are dependent and need things done for them. In this way Jesus shows that his kingdom values are very different. Instead of promoting one own prestige, the focus must be on the other, on the most vulnerable members of societyô the poor, those who have no wealth or power, those who need things done for themô like little children.

In reaching out and caring for the most vulnerable members of society (like children), one is, in reality, receiving Jesus himself and ultimately welcoming God. Jesus repeats this same message later in his final sermon in Matthew& Gospel on the judgment of the nations where he says. õWhatever you did for one of these least brothers [and sisters] of mine, you did for meö (Matthew 25:40).
